Body-worn products are the most prevalent strategy for continence management in adults with urinary or fecal incontinence. To find the best information in the industry on these products, the WOCN held a peer review to identify the important considerations for body worn products.

The outcome? The Wound Ostomy & Continence Nurses Society Journal's (JWOCN) peer-reviewed article, *Assessment, Selection, Use and Evaluation of Body-Worn Absorbent Products for Adults with Incontinence*, that provides pure, clinical evidence to help guide facilities and caregivers.

It's important to remember... There is no single answer for everyone. Follow this summary to help you choose the right products for a pathway to the best outcomes for your patients!

PATIENT ASSESSMENT



Potential outcomes when following these guidelines include:

- A good night's sleep with less interruptions
- Lower skin pH levels due to better fit and improved breathability
- Lower chances of incontinence-associated dermatitis due to a healthy microclimate and less humidity
- Lower likelihood of pressure ulcers
- Enhanced personal dignity
- Increased ability to interact with others while containing and concealing incontinence
- Higher health-related quality of life

BODY WORN PRODUCT RECOMMENDATIONS

Guards and Shields



"...consider contour, shape, and other design elements to maximize effectiveness and comfort."

"Panelists noted that while these absorbent products are specifically designed for men, variability in their design is necessary given the variety of body contours of the various men seeking effective containment of light urinary incontinence, and no particular design can be identified as suitable for all men with light urinary incontinence."



Pads & Panty Liners



"In women with light incontinence, inserted, disposable pads designed for containment of urine are less likely to leak and are ranked higher by users..."



Butterfly® Body Patches



"An absorbent pad designed to place between the cheeks of the buttocks and over the anus reduces leakage of fecal matter onto perianal skin or underclothing, remains in place in a majority of users, and is preferred over an absorbent brief or products not designed for containment of fecal incontinence."



Unisex Pull-Ups



"In general, [underwear] should be selected in preference to inserts to minimize leakage. Unisex pull-ups are a baseline recommendation for moderate - heavy users with dual daytime incontinence."

Men and women leak at different volume-outputs. Consider absorbency level of the product to ensure a best fit.



Disposable Briefs



"... strongly recommended selecting a brief with a seal/reseal mechanism that provides not only containment but also safety for the patient and caregiver. "

"Contemporary designs provide variable degrees of breathability, allowing airflow to the inner aspect of the product and the user's skin without compromising containment of liquid within the product."
